Broadband

Commercial fibre deployment continues at pace, closel monitored by the Connecting Cambridgeshire team. Project Gigabit's delivery phase 1 (of 4) is in build, with the first connected premises going live in July 2024. And Openreach's broadband upgrade plans for Cambridgeshire were announced at the end of May, meaning full fibre broadband is heading to a further 16 Cambridgeshire towns and villages, as part of a huge upgrade. The areas are: Burwell, Chatteris, Crafts Hill (Bar Hill) Cheveley, Fowlmere, Harston, Kimbolton, Melbourn, Newton, Papworth St Agnes, Parson Drove, Cambridge Science Park, Steeple Morden, Sawston, Swavesey and West Wratting.

Guidance **Gigabit Broadband Voucher Scheme** information Updated 7 June 2024

We're continuing discussions with BDUK about un-pausing the Rural Gigabit Voucher Scheme within Cambridgeshire and will keep Members updated when we know more. Good news is that BDUK are considering a complementary voucher scheme for urban premises to help address the not-spots in urban areas often caused by complex and expensive civils/connection costs. We don't know a timescale for this yet but it's likely to be next year.

Mobile coverage improvements

We have had some contact from members regarding mobile coverage issues. We are discussing these with the Mobile operators but also with a shared infrastructure provider who is planning to install some masts that can be shared by all Mobile operators to improve coverage in the areas highlighted by the mobile coverage survey.






District Digital Overviews
